Presentation on Characteristics of Living things - Grade 6 'A'

Characteristics of living things- Respiration Presentation by Ganvi. She explained the important characteristics of living things-Respiration by different living organisms like, Human beings, Plants, earthworms, Fishes, Cockroaches and so on.

Reaction of Acids and Bases with metals/metal carbonates / metal bicarbonates Grade 10 'A' and 'B'

Experimental investigation:

- 1. Zinc with HCl
- 2. Zinc with NaOH
- 3. Sodium carbonate with HCl
- 4. Sodium bi carbonate with HCI

Following observations were made:

- » Expts 1 & 2
- Hydrogen gas evolution
- » Expts 3 & 4
- Carbon dioxide evolution.
- Confirmatory test for Hydrogen (pop sound) and
- Carbon dioxide(brisk effervescence) also done.

Acid-Base indicators Grade 10 'A' and 'B'

Experimental investigation:

Two sample solutions (HCl, NaOH) were given and students identified the acidic and basic solution with the help of following natural and synthetic indicators-

- Red Litmus paper
- Methyl orange
- Phenolphthalein, from the change of their color.









They observed the following:

- 1. Red litmus turns blue in NaOH
- 2. Methyl orange turns to yellow in NaOH
- 3. Phenolphthalein(colourless solution) turns to pink in the basic solution.

Yardstick Activity

Force and Pressure Grade 8 'A'

It is very amusing to see a man lifting a car just by rotating the lever of a jack. How is it possible to lift heavier things by applying less force? This activity provides an opportunity to students to explore and understand the working of a hydraulic jack. They discover the applicability of Pascal's law on fluids.

Sorting materials into groups - Grade 6 'A'

Students learnt about the texture, solubility, transparency and luster of the different materials like cotton, iron bolt, seeds, thread, rubber, food color, glue etc., by experimental investigation.

Community helpers Grade 1 'A'

Learners did an excellent job by matching the helpers with their place of work. It helped them to learn the need of helping each other and build a sense of responsibility.

Safety Measures Grade 2 'B'

Children of Grade 2 enjoyed the activity and also understood the importance of safety. They were also able to understand the safety measures that depend and vary according to the place.











• Fire Alarm, Flow of heat Grade 7'A'

A fire sensor is an alarm which rings when there's a fire.

Students constructed the fire sensor and observed its workings.

Deduced the mechanism behind its function.

They understood the fact that matter expands on heating.

Different metals have different rates of expansion A bimetallic strip works based on thermal expansions of solids.

On heating it expands and the circuit gets closed and the alarm works (the bulb glows) It was an exciting experience for them.

Independence Day 2022


It is a day to celebrate "tricolor with liberty, beauty in diversity, unity in differences, and brotherhood of the largest democracy in the world". The celebrations aim at inspiring people to be innovative and determined to build a new India that will stand united by thoughts, deeds, and aspirations and cherish its rich diversities as the wealth of the nation and not as hindrances to its unity. Faith in one's religion need not make us intolerant of other religions; pride in the richness of one's language need not deny to ourselves opportunities to learn other languages; State borders need not mean the limit of our concerns.

The theme of this Independence Day is "Nation First, Always First" is addressed to formation of our priorities, and to conditioning our thoughts and actions to keep nation first after 74 years of freedom and sacrifices of several great men and women in varied fields to achieve that freedom and while working a vibrant democracy echoing people's voices through different media, and winning several world records and achievements to be proud of.

This Independence Day theme sounds different from that of the last two years. Atmanirbhar Bharat" or Self-reliant India that was the theme in 2020 and "Support our Troops, Salute Our Troops" which was the theme in 2019 denote a call for positive action. Significantly, 2018 theme "One Country, One People" was a reminder for unity similar to the theme of this year.

In 2015, a specific programme of action, Swachch Bharat was chosen as a serious mission in our country. It was labeled "Towards True Freedom" – freedom from dirt, squalor, and garbage. It specified some other freedoms also - freedom from financial untouchability (Jan Dhan Yojana), Freedom from Illiteracy for Girl child (Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao), Freedom from Archaic Labour Laws (Sharam Dev Jayate), Freedom from being Unfunded (PM Mudra Yojana).

Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav is a central government initiative to honour and celebrate 75 years of advancement in India as well as the illustrious past of its people, culture, and achievements. On March 12th, 2021. The "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav" began 75 weeks before August 15th, 2022, and it will last until August 15th, 2023. The initiative's five pillars - Freedom Struggle, Ideas at 75, Achievements at 75, Actions at 75, and Resolves at 75 — serve as compass points for progress while serving as an inspiration for ambitions and obligations.



• Freedom Struggle

This theme anchors the commemoration initiatives under Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav which include commemorating milestones in history, unsung heroes, etc. The motive is to revisit the historical road leading up to 15th August 1947 and bring to life the tales of unsung heroes whose sacrifices have made freedom a reality for us. Major events celebrated under this theme were Birsa Munda Jayanti (Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas), Declaration of Provisional Government of Free India by Netaji, Shaheed Diwas, etc.

• Ideas @ 75


This theme focuses on activities and gatherings motivated by concepts and principles that have influenced us and will serve as our compass during this Amrit Kaal (the 25-year period between India @ 75 and India @100). Popular, participatory activities that help highlight India's distinctive contribution to the globe are included in the events like Kashi Utsav, which honours Hindi literary giants from the Kashi region, and Postcards to the Prime Minister, in which more than 75 lakh kids express their visions for India in 2047 and their impressions of unsung independence fighters.

• Achievements @ 75

This theme focuses on marking the passage of time and all our milestones along the way. It is envisioned that it will develop into a public record of our combined accomplishments as a 75-year-old independent nation with a 5000+year-old legacy. Initiatives like Swarnim Vijay Varsh, which honours the victory of 1971, the opening of the Shreshtha Yojana during Mahaparinirvan Diwas, etc. are just a couple of the events and projects that fall under this theme.

• Actions @ 75

The aim of this pillar of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav is to emphasize the actions being done to put policies into effect and fulfill promises in order to assist India assume its proper place in the new global order emerging in a post-covid world.



It is propelled by Prime Minister Modi's clarion call, "SABKA SAATH, SABKA VIKAS, SABKA VISHWAS, SABKA PRAYAS". It includes pledges from corporations, NGOs, and civil society that help us realize our ideals and work together to build a better tomorrow. It also includes government policies, and initiatives like Gati Shakti - National Master Plan for Multi-modal Connectivity are among the programmes falling under this theme.

• Resolves @ 75

This project aims to strengthen commitments to particular targets and goals. This subject focuses on our shared resolve and commitment to influencing the course of our motherland. Only through collective resolve, well-laid-out action plans, and determined efforts will ideas translate into actions. Events and programs under this theme include initiatives such as Constitution Day, Good Governance Week, etc. that help bring alive the commitment towards the 'Planet And People' (a UN initiative).
