They are able to choose books based on their own interests. However, the initiative has particular requirements to ensure that every student, teacher, and staff member reads and that the reading culture is maintained.



Spindle Box - Prep I

The spindle box develops early counting skills and develops the association between quantity and the number symbols 0-9. Importantly, it teaches the concept of zero. The wooden box has ten numbered compartments into which the child counts the corresponding number of tactile wooden spindles.



Jump, Hit and say "an" and "at" family of words - Prep II

Students were able to identify, recognize, and say the 'at' and 'an' family words. This activity made kids a lot of fun and helps kids to improve their vocabulary, comprehension, and reading skills.



Tens Frame - Prep II

Students were able to count the Counters and arrange them in various ways to represent different numbers, which visually assisted youngsters in developing strong numbers and understanding different visual representations of numbers, as well as boosting counting skills and making counting values simpler.



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Doctors' Day Visit To Hospital - Prep II

To acknowledge the contribution and to honour our saviour's effort, National Doctors' day was celebrated at Tattva School with great zeal. The occasion commemorates the spirit of doctors across the globe who works day and night to ensure well-being of patients. So, as a token of gratitude, students greeted doctors of RR hospital by giving thank you card children thank the MEDICAL FRATERNITY for their selfless contributions. The students also presented roses and gifts to the doctors and expressed their gratitude for their presence and dedication. Workshops were organised by the doctors of RR Hospital for the Pre-primary, Primary and Middle School children separately on the topic on dental health. They made the students realize and understand the importance of healthy teeth and its maintenance.



Backward Counting - Prep II

Students were able to count the backward number by counting backward, the brain is given a task to focus on something that is not related to anxious thoughts. This can help to clear the mind of anxiety, allowing the individual to stay focused and calm.

Monster feeding (sorting the objects by its colour) - Prep I

Sorting different colours is an important cognitive skill that teaches a child to notice similarities and differences and how to categorize. It helps develop order, visual perceptual thinking, and memory skills.

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Popsicle Shapes - Prep I

Learning shapes helps children identify and organize visual information. Shapes encourage pre-schoolers to visualize and connect to the world around them. Learning shapes also helps children understand other signs and symbols, such as street signs or icons on a computer app.



Creating Patterns - Prep I

Children first learn about patterns by discriminating similarities and differences as they sort. As they begin to understand the relationships between objects, they can start to make predictions. They then proceed to the recognition of visual, kinesthetic, and auditory patterns in their environment.



Read and Create ab Words Tree - Prep II

Students were able to identify read and comprehend. The advantages of learning three-letter words for kids are encouraging them to learn, write, read, and understand the new vocabulary words. Learning these words also enhances a child's 3 performance and improves spelling skills.



Reading - Prep II

Children can learn sounds, words, and language as well as early literacy skills through reading and sharing stories. Learn to appreciate stories and books. Encourage a child's creativity and curiosity. It aids in the growth of a child's mental faculties for concentration, socialisation, and communication.



"a" family word wheel - Prep II

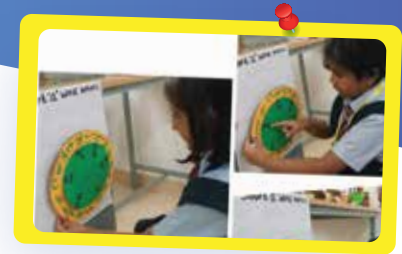
Students were able to identify and read the "a" family words. Word wheels are a popular strategy for teaching and



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promoting the use of vocabulary. They can be used in a variety of ways Word wheels allow for thorough word analysis and deep understanding of unfamiliar words. Students must explore a word from several angles. The word wheel provides a visual reference for concepts and vocabulary.



Culmination Day - Show and tell - Prep II

Students were able to recognise the things and discuss them. Children have the chance to talk in front of their friends during show and tell about a subject that interests them or to exhibit a favourite item. It boosts self-assurance and aids in the growth of children's communication abilities.



Ice Cream Stick Activity - Nursery

It helps children in building structures and creating artwork, as well as developing fine motor skills and identifying standing and slanting lines.



Name Card Making Activity - Prep I

Knowing each other by name promotes community building and relationships in the classroom. Students will begin building friendships and partnerships as soon as they start learning each other's names. A robust, healthy classroom community will result from students' positive interactions with one another.



Compared to how I looked when I was a baby - Prep II

Students had the opportunity to discuss how they have changed since they were babies and compare how they looked then. Kids can better comprehend their own needs and recognize their own skills by becoming more self-aware.



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Identifying Sight Words in the Storybooks - Prep II

Students appreciated recognizing sight words in storybooks. Words that repeat often in children's reading material are known as sight words. For better reading comprehension and speed, you must be able to recognize these words "by sight".



Play Dough with letter Aa - Prep I

Play dough with the letter Aa helps kids develop their hand-eye coordination, motor skills, dexterity, creativity, and attention span.



Sand Tracing Activity - Nursery

Tracing on sand helps children gain confidence in their ability to form letters freehand. Tracing the Letters repeatedly improves their fine motor abilities. Children have a strong sense of touch, and the smooth grains of Sand tracing, when paired with visual, muscular, and aural reinforcement, reinforces the knowledge of Letters in the freehand manner.



Greater than and Less than - Prep II

This concept can be tricky, but remembering that the hungry alligator always eats more can help kids! Adorable alligators that represent these symbols for kids to use to solve math problems. After working together, young learners were able to identify the Greater than and less than symbols used and show the relationship between two numbers. They show us which has a higher value and are used to help children get to grips with numbers and their values.



Counting with Popsicle sticks - Prep I

It will help the students to consolidate their counting skills with Popsicle sticks.

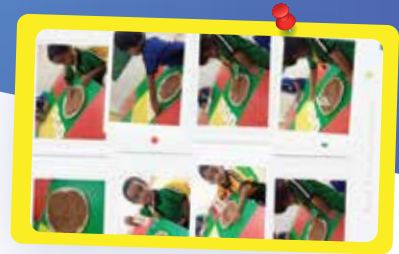


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Searching The Hidden Numbers in Sand - Nursery

Searching for a number in a sand tray helps toddlers identify numbers and develops fine motor skills.



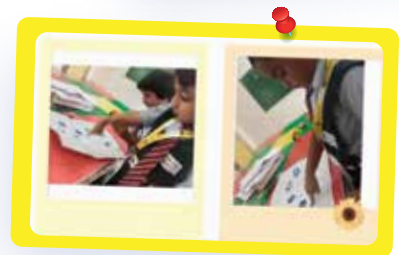
Thumb Print Activity - Nursery

It helps children to develop their fine motor skills and colour identification.



Hand Print Activity - Prep I

Hand print art develops fine motor abilities that will be important for later handwriting. The movement and coordination of reaching for the paints and printing them on the spot are explored by children as they use their hands. It also enhances and encourages eye-hand coordination, creative thinking and colour recognition.



Paper Palm Cut-outs - Prep II

Children identified the colour blue and pasted blue palm cut-outs onto the jelly fish chart provided. This activity helps youngsters to practice fine motor skills as well as colour recognition.



Cotton Cutting - Nursery

Cotton cutting is a sensory activity designed to improve fine motor skills and pincer grip. It also improves concentration, coordination, and self-reliance.

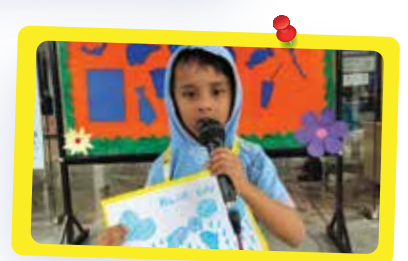

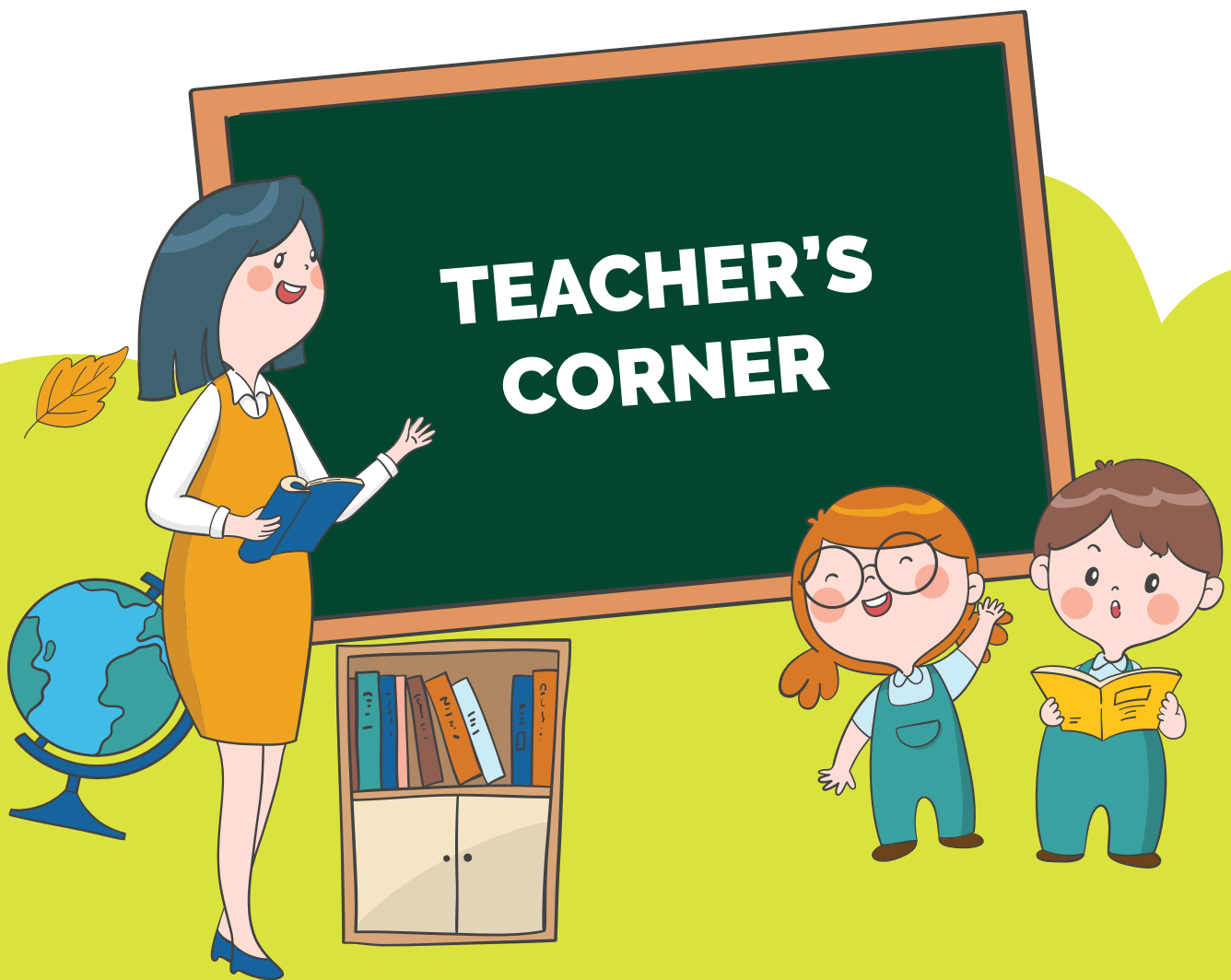


Blue Day
