Research a Topic and share

They were graded according to how quickly they moved along the number line and stopped at the precise number that was determined to be the correct response. Science - Measurement and Motion

Students were allowed to create a jitterbug model. And by engaging in this jitterbug activity, an object can display multiple types of motion simultaneously.

Mathematics - Factors

Students were able to find the prime numbers between 1 to 100 by crossing out the multiples of 2,3,5,7,... It was observed that the numbers which were left out without crossing out were prime numbers which have factors as 1 and





itself. Students were able to differentiate between prime numbers and composite numbers by Hands on activity and also identified '1' as unique number.

English - Arranging words in alphabetical order

to alphabetize, children go through four stages:

- 1. Arranging letters in order,
- 2. Alphabetizing to the first letter,
- 3. Alphabetizing to the second and third letters.
- 4. Study advanced rules.

Students were shown instances of how, when two or more words begin with the same letter, the second letter comes into play when sorting items alphabetically. If the second and third letters are the same, the fourth letter must be evaluated, and so on.


