Test for Starch in leaves - Grade VII 'A'

Green leaf is boiled in ethanol in a water bath and chlorophyll get dissolved in ethanol, the leaf washed with water. When few drops of iodine solution is added on the leaf it turns blue black and shows the presence of starch, it was an interesting experience for students.

Coding - Creating a Calculator Grade VI 'A' & 'B'

Coding is an essential skill in today's digital world, equipping students with the ability to understand and create technology rather than just consume it. Coding programming language was introduced in grade VI to empower students with critical thinking, problem-solving abilities, and creativity. This foundational course provides them with the tools they need to succeed in a tech-driven future.

Operations on Rational Numbers Grade VIII 'B'

Students were given different rational numbers and expressions on index cards, such as $(a+b)$, $(a-b)$, a/b , $b-a$, etc. They were able to perform operations on rational numbers."

Acids, Bases & Salts - Grade X 'A' & 'B'

Students were given pH paper and tested with the following solutions .

HCl, NaOH, Acetic acid, Lemon juice, water, Sodium bicarbonate solution.

They match the colour with the pH chart and based on pH value they concluded the nature of the solutions.

Place Value - Grade V 'A'

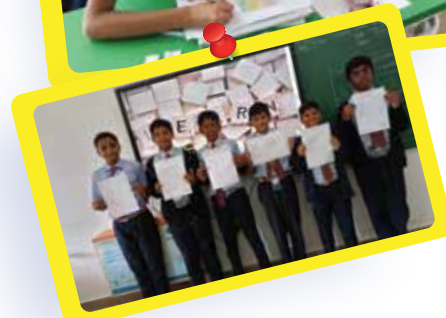
Students were divided into groups of two, with each student randomly selecting number cards from 0 to 9 and placing them on an 8-digit place value chart. Through this activity, they were able to read numbers in both the Indian and International systems of numeration. Using the same cards, they were also able to build the largest and smallest 8-digit numbers.

Rational Numbers - Grade VIII 'A'

Students were given different rational numbers and performed addition/subtraction by representing them on a row and column grid. They found solutions by cancelling positive and negative integers. They explored this using various rational numbers.

Yardstick Activity- Food We Eat Grade III 'A' & 'B'

Students are able to understand the concept of eating a balanced diet and the classification of nutrients in foods into 5 basic categories: Carbohydrates, Proteins, Protective Foods, and Roughages.

Fire Mock Drill

A mock fire and evacuation drill involving students and teachers was conducted on 20th June 2024 at Tattva School – Kumbalgudu to create awareness among the students about fire-fighting techniques and the ways to respond swiftly in times of such emergency situations. A demonstration of using fire safety equipment was conducted by the experts from the Department of Fire and Emergency services to sensitize the staff and students about life-saving and rescue techniques in case of fire.

A group of staff armed with necessary paraphernalia required for firefighting and rescue operations positioned themselves at vantage points to guide and assist the students in the mock fire and evacuation drill.

The “evacuation” operation began moments after the fire alarm alerted the students. The students were immediately evacuated from their classrooms and asked to gather at the assembly area.

The mock drill was carried out in the school to prepare students and teachers for any such eventuality under the fire risk reduction programme.

It was organized to check the readiness of the school to face any such fire emergency and also to make the students and staff awareness about the Fire Fighting rescue operation.

Latitudes and Longitudes - Grade V 'A' & 'B'

Students prepared a model of a fishbone to demonstrate the important parallels of latitudes and the Prime Meridian.

Latitude: An imaginary horizontal line that runs from west to east.

Longitude: An imaginary vertical line that runs from the North Pole to the South Pole.

Yardstick Activity - Assembling Internal Organs - Grade II

Students in grade II were able to recognize and understand the functions of internal organs. They also learned the difference between sense organs and internal organs.

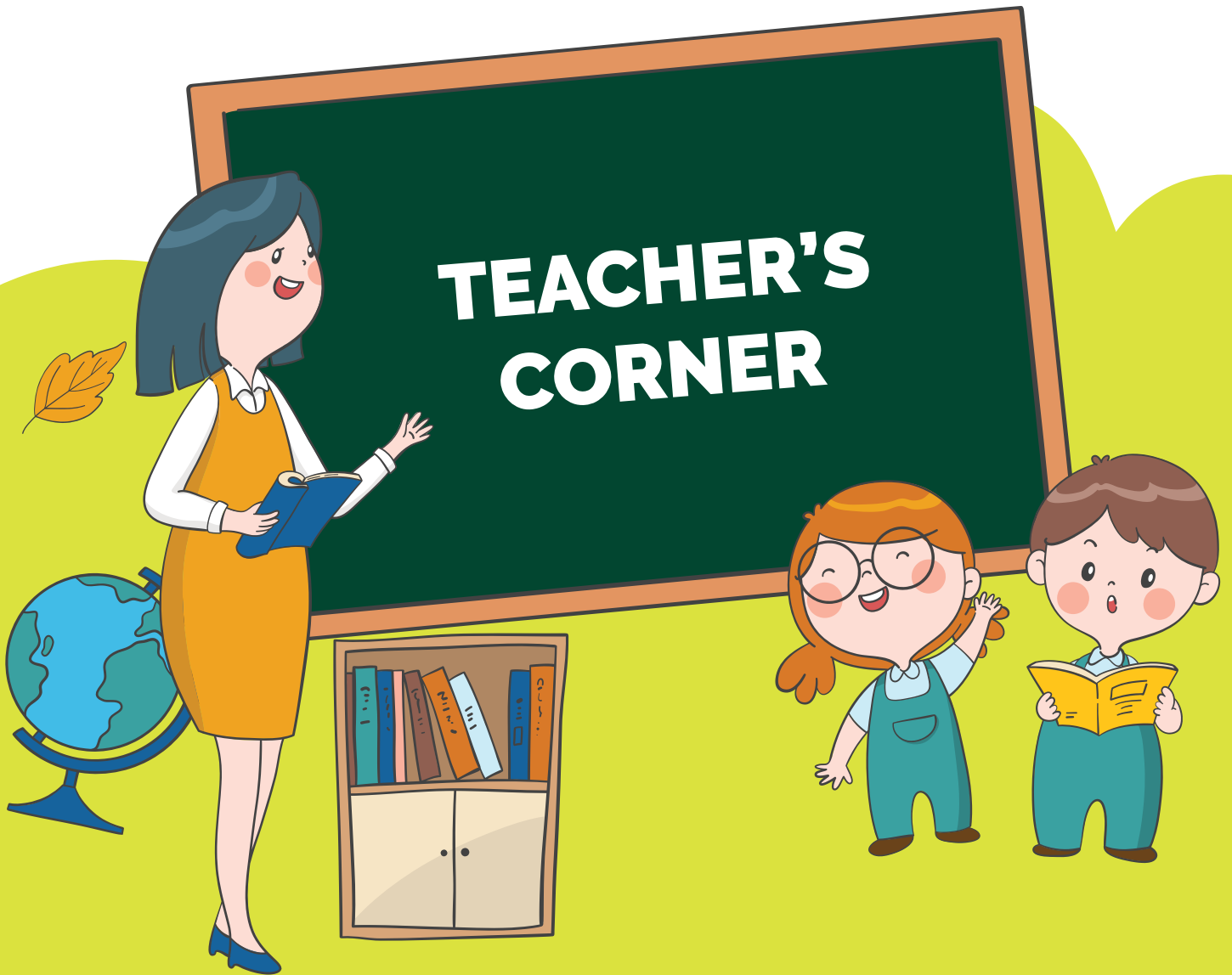
