Events & Activities

Alphabets Using Clay Dough - Nursery

To teach children how to use clay dough to create the letters A and B.

Outcome: The children were given clay dough to create the letters A and B. Under the teacher's guidance, they learnt to form a standing line, a sleeping line, and a curved line to shape these letters. The children were thrilled and enthusiastic about the fun activity, and they grasped the concept of these different lines with great understanding.

Collage Parts of the Face - Nursery

To familiarize children with the different parts of the face, including the eyes, nose, mouth, ears, and lips.

Outcome: Today, we engaged in a creative and educational activity centered around the parts of the face. Children were provided with cut-out shapes representing various facial features. They were tasked with assembling these parts on a blank face template, ensuring that each feature was placed in its correct location. The children participated in a hands-on collage project where they identified and arranged various facial features to create complete faces. This activity was designed to enhance their understanding of facial anatomy and improve their spatial awareness and fine motor skills.

CVC Words Reading

Children were asked to complete the puzzle and read the words.

Outcome: Completing puzzles helps children develop essential cognitive skills. As they manipulate puzzle pieces and figure out where they fit, kids improve their spatial awareness, hand-eye coordination, and fine motor skills. Puzzles also promote logical thinking, reasoning, and problem-solving abilities.





Field Trip to Big Banyan Tree & Police Station

On a pleasant Monday 12th August morning, Kindergarten students were taken on a field trip to the Big banyan tree Kethohalli where they got a chance to see the 'Dodda Aalada Mara', literally translated to Big Banyan Tree, is a giant approximately 400-year-old banyan tree. This single plant covers 3 acres (1.2 ha) and is one of the largest of its kind. In the 2000s, the main root of the tree succumbed to natural disease, and thus the tree now looks like many different trees. Later kids were taken to the police station. The Police Sub-Inspector spoke to the children about how a police station operates. Students visited the control room, jail, FIR room and were informed about arms and ammunition like guns, pistols etc. They learnt how to call no. 911 in an emergency situation, ways to protect themselves and to avoid dangerous situations. Children were told what happens when a person is arrested, how police personnel works and how it helps officers do their job. Initially the children were very serious when they entered the police station, but when they interacted with the sub- inspector they found that the police man's are friendly and approachable. Overall, it was a wonderful experience for them which they will remember for days to come.

Five Sense Organs

To help children understand and appreciate the five senses—sight, hearing, touch, taste, and smell.

Outcome: At school, we organized an activity to help children explore the five senses. We demonstrated how each sense works by engaging them with various experiences: they touched different toys to feel textures, tasted sugar to explore flavour, smelled the fragrance of flowers to understand scent, and listened to beats to experience sound. Children enjoyed participating as we demonstrated each sense through hands-on experiences.





Kannada Letter Puzzle

Children were asked solve the the puzzle saying the letter sound.

Outcome: By using their logical reasoning, they figure out which piece of the puzzle goes where thus also improving their memory. Therefore, this puzzle is a great first introduction to letters for children and this in turn promotes their literacy skills.

Making a Number 4 in Different Ways - Prep II

Knowing that numbers can be represented in different ways is key to building a strong foundation in the number sense.

Number Names - Prep II

Children were given a Tens Frame, and some chits with the number names written on them were kept on the table. Kids were invited to pick up the chit, read, and keep the number of pom-poms on the tens frame.

Outcome: Children gained a foundation for counting and mathematical skills.

Patterns

Enhancing Colour Recognition and Pattern Differentiation in Early Childhood Education

Outcome: In this activity, children wore uniforms with distinct colours and patterns, such as red and yellow, which helped them recognize and distinguish between different visual designs. To further reinforce their understanding of colours, they used red and yellow chairs. This setup allowed them to learn not only to identify and differentiate the colours but also to predict the sequence, understanding that yellow typically followed red and vice versa. This approach





combined visual patterns with colour recognition, enhancing their ability to recognize and predict colour sequences in a playful and educational manner.

Patterns

Visual Learning and Cognitive Development in Early Childhood.

Outcome: In this activity, children worked with red and pink circle cut-outs to explore colour recognition and sequencing. By arranging these circles, they learned to identify and differentiate the colours while predicting and understanding the sequence in which colours typically appeared. For example, they observed that yellow often followed pink and vice versa. This method combined visual pattern recognition with colour differentiation, making the learning process both engaging and educational.

English Alphabet - Prep I

To teach children how to use play dough to make the letters ABCDE.

Outcome: Children were asked to make the letters ABCDE using play dough. Children enjoyed the fun activity and learnt the formation of letters. By doing this activity children enhanced their fine motor skills and formation of letters.

Krishna Janmashtami

At Tattva school Kumbalgodu, Krishna Janmashtami was celebrated by the staff and students of Pre-primary on Thursday, 22nd August 2024. Janmashtami is celebrated as a symbol of the end of darkness and rooting out of the evil forces.





Our assembly began as usual with the school prayer, followed by the word of the day, the thought of the day, the pledge, and the national anthem. Later, the children were led to the quadrangle area where Lord Krishna Pooja was taking place, right in front of our school principal, Mrs. Mamtha Rao and school staff. 
Special Assembly on Green Day
