Yardstick – Living and Non Living things - Grade III 'A' & 'B'

The Living Train

- **1.** Students are able to sort out the living and non-living things.

Factory – Identify the Factors of the Number Grade IV 'B'

Students were divided into 4 groups. Each group was given number tokens. Each member from the group found the factors of that given number.

Multiples - Grade V'B'

Students were given instructions to draw a grid and write the numbers from 1-100 on A4 sheet. They were asked to roll the dice to get two numbers. Then the students started marking the multiples and common multiples of two numbers in grid and finally able to find the LCM.

Sound - Grade IX 'B'

Students were able to verify the law of reflection of sound by moving the hollow tubes across a certain angle. They were able to hear the ticking sound of clock kept at one end of the hollow tube when the angle of incidence and reflection are same. They were able to verify the same with different angles

Presentation of the Thar Desert Grade IV 'A' & 'B'

Understand the unique environmental conditions and challenges of living in a desert. 2. Identify the adaptations and survival strategies of plants and animals in desert ecosystems.

Yardstick – Reproduction in Animals Grade IV 'A' & 'B'

Life Cycle

- **1.** Students are able to understand the different stages of life cycle present in the animals and importance of each stage in their life cycle.
- **2.** Students are now able to understand the characteristic features of each stage of life cycle of an organism.





Role Enactment - Grade IV 'A' & 'B'

Students will enact roles of the Jackal and the Holy Man from the story "The Tiger, the Holy Man, and the Jackal." The role play will imagine what might have happened after the events described in the story, allowing students to demonstrate their creativity and explore alternate endings. This activity is designed to enhance students' speaking skills by encouraging them to deliver dialogues confidently, while also fostering their ability to think creatively and engage with the characters. Through this role enactment, students will practice pronunciation, intonation, and expressive language, contributing to their overall language development.

Structure of Matter - Grade VII 'A'

A. Mixture

Iron fillings and sulphur powder mixed in a watch glass and taken as sample of mixture.

B. Compound

When this mixture is heated a black coloured compound FeS is formed.


"Si sisi si dolada Yaku sine ladu banaha Banaha

This song is a Congolese folk song. The language of this song is kiluba. Song means the joy of living.


