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Events & Activities



Ganesha Idol Making - Pre-primary

Playing with modeling clay will help children to develop important skills like fine motor development, and hand-eye coordination, improve pre-writing skills, and have a calming effect if a child is restless. Our kindergarten children got an opportunity to create Lord Ganesh using play dough following the teachers instructions. Our NURSERY, LKG, and UKG Children made the mouse, ladoos and lord Ganesh using modeling clay. Children enjoyed the activity and learned a new way of art in the process.



Playdough Octopus, Dolphin - Prep I

Squeezing play dough can help children ease tension, release excess energy, improve focus, and express emotions.

Outcome: Children were happy to do water animals like octopus, fish, etc. using play dough.



Curly Hair - Nursery

Creating a Vibrant and Colorful Curly Hair Art Portrait.

Outcome: Children were introduced to the diversity of hair types through an engaging and hands-on approach. By crafting portraits with various colorful and curly hairstyles, they explored the unique characteristics and textures of different hair types. This activity not only allowed them to appreciate the beauty of curly hair but also highlighted that every hair type is special and worthy of celebration. Through their creative expressions, children learned to recognize and value the diversity in hair types.



Flower - Prep II

Children were asked to touch and explore the flowers (Types of flowers, Shape, Size and Colour).

Outcome: Learning about flowers invites preschoolers to



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explore the beauty of nature and plants. Learning about the parts of a flower, what a flower needs to grow, and different varieties of flowers encourages young children to engage in the growing process.

Identifying and Sorting Plant Parts - Nursery

Outcome: The teacher introduced the terms Leaf, Flower, and Root to the children. They were then asked to sort natural plant parts into these categories. The activity involved placing actual leaves, flowers, and roots into their respective groups. This hands-on exercise helped the children learn about the different plant structures and their functions. By organizing these natural plant parts, they gained a clearer understanding of how each component contributes to the plant.

Alphabets Sand Drawing

Enhancing Alphabet Skills Through Creative Sand Drawing Activities.

Outcome: The children had a blast drawing letters in the sand during their school activity. This engaging experience blended fun with learning, enabling them to practice their alphabet skills in a creative and enjoyable manner.

Parts of Plants - Prep II

Parts of plant puzzles were given to all kids to solve.

Outcome: Identification, classification and description of plants.

World Tourism Day - Pre-primary

Tiny Tots at Tattva School had a special assembly on "World Tourism Day". This date was chosen since the UNWTO's statutes were adopted on that day in 1970. The acceptance of



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these sculptures is regarded as a significant achievement for world travel. This day aims to highlight how tourism impacts social, cultural, and economic values globally and to increase awareness of the role that tourism plays in global society. All of our Pre-Primary students dressed up today, sporting masks, binoculars, hats, and goggles. Pre-primary educators planned a special assembly intending to showcase India's various states and cultures. With great joy, the students began their journey with their companions by bus from Kempegowda bus station to Mysore, by train from Mysore to Kerala, by flight from Kerala to Tamil Nadu, and by boat from Tamil Nadu to Mangalore. It was an assembly full of knowledge for everyone.

Sorting Farm Animals - Prep I

A sorting activity item includes farm animal toys and wild animals toys. Sorting is the ability to identify similarities and differences among a set of objects and grouping them accordingly. When the child is engaged in these types of activities, they can build fundamental skills. Children are ready to identify animals.

Thumb Impression Painting - Nursery

Outcome: The children had a fantastic time during the activity! Using their thumbs, they created colourful flowers. The teacher provided yellow, green, and orange paint in plastic containers. The kids dipped their thumbs into the paint and made impressions in their books, filling the pages with vibrant floral designs. Everyone participated with enthusiasm and joy!



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Thumbprint Activity - Prep I

Improve fine motor skills: Thumb printing helps children develop the small muscles in their hands, which are important for holding writing tools and making precise movements.

Outcome: Kids enjoyed Thumb printing in a fun way to strengthen their hand and finger muscles in a new way for children to explore printing & enhance their aesthetic sense.



Action Game - Prep II

The teacher invited the students to act out the inverse of the word.

Outcome: Understanding the concept of opposites is important as it helps a child to learn how to compare two different things and to develop a more concrete understanding of a specific concept (e.g. hot vs cold). Learning opposites also improves a child's ability to describe things.



Counting Numbers Using Ice Cream Sticks Prep I

Children arranged the ice cream sticks using number flashcards. In this method, child sees and touches the numbers they're adding using Ice cream sticks as counters.

Outcome: They are affordable, easy to find, and provide a tangible, visual representation of numbers and mathematical operations.



CCA - Diwali - Pre-primary

Outcome: The children painted diyas and decorated them with beads. They learned how diyas are made and the significance of lighting them during festival days. The teachers guided the children to light the diyas and place them on the rangoli.



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Farm Animals & Foods - Nursery

Outcome: To help the kids understand what farmers look like, Madhava dressed up like a farmer. They picked up new vocabulary like hay, seeds, grass, and leaves while learning about farm animals and food. Additionally, the children had the opportunity to see, feel, and touch the different types of food.

Fruits - Prep I

Fruit is the sweet, fleshy, edible part of a plant. It generally contains seeds. Fruits are usually eaten raw, although some varieties can be cooked. They come in a wide variety of colours, shapes and flavours.

Global Visa - Prep I & II

They learned about the continent of Asia and the nation of India during this lesson. The teacher also gave them an explanation of the country's culture, national symbols, capital, and location on a global map. Later, they were led to create the Indian tricolour flag.

Outcome: Identify the geographical features of India, locate India on a map, describe the history and culture of India.

Let's make lemonade

Squeeze the juice from the lemons in one bowl, hot water, pinch of salt, and add sugar stirring constantly until it dissolves, Ready to serve with glass.

Outcome: Talk about the colour, consistency, smell, and taste of the lemonade. The lemon to explore it with their senses.



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Nature's Delights Discovery - Nursery

Outcome: The kids learned about the amazing goods that come from a variety of animals, like the warm, soft wool from sheep, the fresh, creamy milk from cows, the wholesome eggs from hens, and the delectable honey from honeybees. During the demonstration, they even had the opportunity to sample the honey, which added to the enjoyment of the incredible gifts that nature bestows upon them!



Number Recognition Through Beads - Prep II

Children were asked to represent the numbers from 61 to 70 using coloured beads.

Outcome: The Montessori bead bars are made of coloured beads arranged on a wire in quantities of one to ten. Each bead bar quantity is represented by a distinct colour, which helps a child recognize the quantity associated with the colour of the beads. It is used to independently learn fundamental mathematical concepts, such as counting, addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division.



People Helping Us - Prep II

Outcome: Understand who is a chef and what a chef, farmer, fruit, vegetable seller and Cook does.



Public Speaking Skills - Prep I

Food is one of the basic necessities of life. Food contains nutrients—substances essential for the growth, repair, and maintenance of body tissues and for the regulation of vital processes. Nutrients provide the energy our bodies need to function.

Outcome: Kid's shared their favourite foods confidently.



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Rawa Tracing - Prep I

Fine motor skills helps to eye hand co-ordination. Tracing on suji tray is a creative way to help kids learn to form letters.

Vegetable Crown Making - Prep I

Making vegetable crowns helps kids learn about and develop an interest in new local fruits and vegetables.
