Events & Activities

After & Before Numbers - Prep I

Outcome: Teacher will explain the step activity to find after-before numbers.

Learning about before & after and can help children understand sequence and patterns.

Art & Craft (Parent-Child Activity) - Prep I

Teacher will give parents a child activity with an example. Engage in family activities with their child that give child's motor skills & happy to do the activities with parents.

Bubble Wrap Printing Activity - Prep I

Using paint and mixing colours students can develop understanding of the theory of primary and secondary colours. The students will also develop techniques for creating texture using paint and bubbles – called bubble art.

Colouring Activity Car - Prep I

Teacher will provide a car outline for the colour wheel.

Colouring can help children improve their concentration and focus.

Fish Craft - Nursery

Outcome: The teacher provided the children with large and small circles cut from colourful A4 sheets. The children folded each circle into a semicircle and carefully placed them on the spots where the teacher had applied glue. Piece by piece, the arrangement came together, eventually forming a vibrant and creative fish craft.





Handprint Crab Craft - Nursery

Outcome: The teacher painted both the hands of the children with red paint and guided them to press their handprints onto the craft book. Then, the children glued their eyes separately onto each thumb. After completing the activity, the children learned about where crabs live and their natural habitat.

Lady's finger & Potato Dabbing - Prep I

Lady finger & potato Painting. This is one of the interesting ways to make amazing paintings. In this process, we will be using a ladyfinger's & potato's inner surface to give its impressions and fill the drawing. The process is very simple. ... It is a fun way to learn impression painting for kids.

Addition - Prep II

Students take turns rolling the dice.

They then add the numbers on the dice to find their total. Next, they mark off the corresponding number on their workbook.

Outcome: This game not only helps students practice their addition skills but also encourages them to think strategically and find different ways to reach the target number. It's a great way to make math practice more engaging and interactive.

CCA: Modak Making - Pre-primary

Cognitive skill, Nutrition and food awareness (exploration of healthy food items). Ganesh Chaturthi is set to take place and students can make modaks.

Recipe For Modak Ingredients:

• 1 cup of crumbled biscuit or digestive cookies





- 1/2 cup condensed milk
- 1/2 cup grated coconut (optional)
- 1/4 cup chopped nuts (optional)
- 1/2 tsp cardamom powder

Instructions:

- **1. Mix Ingredients:** In a bowl, mix crumbled biscuits, grated coconut, nuts, and cardamom powder.
- **2. Add Condensed Milk:** Gradually add condensed milk to the mixture until it binds together.
- **3. Shape Modaks:** Take small portions of the mixture, and shape them into Modaks using your hands or a Modak mould.

Paper Plate Parrot Craft - Nursery

Outcome: The children excitedly painted paper plates, carefully using yellow for the beak and red for the parrot's body. Once the paint dried, they worked on adding details by pasting eyes and colourful wings. Each parrot craft began to take shape, showcasing the children's creativity. They proudly admired their vibrant creations, which looked cheerful and full of life. This activity not only brought smiles but also allowed them to explore their artistic skills.

Storytelling - Prep I

Tanya's journey to grandma's house using an ICT board.

Reading through the ICT board is a unique learning for children to learn about the story. Children are happy to do this activity to learn the story quickly.

Recognizing the Number - Nursery

Outcome: Children select a card with dots, count the number of dots on it, then look for the chair labelled with the





corresponding number and sit on it. This activity helps children practice number recognition and counting skills in a fun and interactive way.

Red chillies (Shredded Paper Pasting Activity) - Prep I

Art & Craft: Red chillies (shredded paper pasting activity)

Shredded paper is a tactile sensory learning experience. It encourages relaxation and enjoyment of the process rather than the result and provides a range of social interaction including cooperative and parallel play. This helps children to develop fine motor skills and promotes confidence in children.

Sight Words - Prep I

Sight words (I, Am, An) Reading.

The objective of sight word flashcards for kindergarten is to help children learn to recognize common words instantly while reading. Learning sight words is an important step in a child's literacy development, as it helps them to: Read faster, Build vocabulary, and Learn how words are pronounced or spelled.

Thumbprint - Prep I

Teacher will explain about plants, farmers, and the food we get. How important in life to say thank you for all? Children do the thumbprint activity. The outcome will improve children's knowledge about animals & farmers.

Market Day - Pre-primary

At Tattva, Pre-primary students set up their own vegetable and fruit market as a reinforcement to the topic 'Healthy food'





on Thursday, 28th December 2024. Each child
 brought a fruit and a vegetable which was displayed
 creatively by the staff of Pre-Primary.

Children had a fun-filled experience of ramp walking on red carpet and selling and buying vegetables and fruits from their peers. They were excited using the weighing scale and pretending to be vegetable and fruit vendors and buyers. The enriching experience allowed the students to showcase not only their proficiency in handling money but also to display their marketing skills.

It created an awareness about the importance and consumption of fruits and vegetables in regular diet. This occasion was used to reinforce the concept of the healthy benefits of fruits and vegetables. The tiny tots also learned more about the taste, smell, colour and texture of each fruit and vegetable. Children understood the importance of washing the fruits before eating or cooking and about the benefits of eating fresh fruits.


