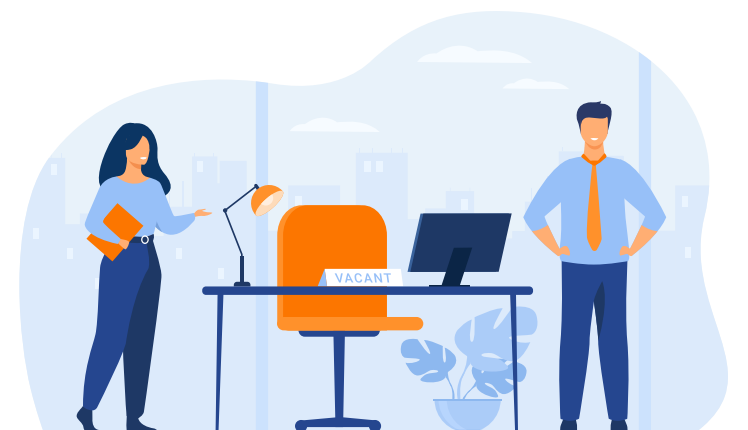

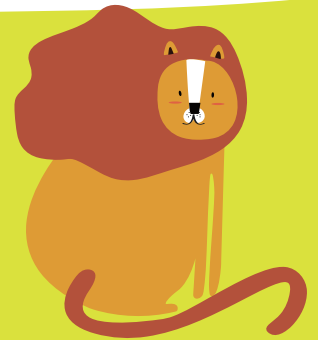

## Student Cabinet Election:

## DRIP IRRIGATION MODEL – CLASS: 8 'B' :

The activity started with the teacher's explanation about the traditional method of drip irrigation (Using earthen pots) followed by student's views and expressions about the traditional methods. Teachers kindled critical thinking skills among students to compare with the modern method of irrigation. Students opined that drip irrigation systems are an effective technique to save water. With step by step guidance and explanation, students were successful in assembling the parts into a working model. Students were assigned the task of completing the observation based on the seed growth which they have sowed.



## Science Chemistry:

Chapter 3 - Metals and Non - metals

Different samples of metals and non-metals were displayed. (Copper turnings, Iron filings, Zinc granules and Magnesium ribbon, Sulphur Powder, Iodine)

Students were asked to identify the elements and classify them as metals and non-metals. They discussed their physical properties like hardness, malleability, ductility etc. This activity was conducted for the students of grade 10 A and B.

### Components of Food by Grade 6 :

#### 1. Testing for sugar

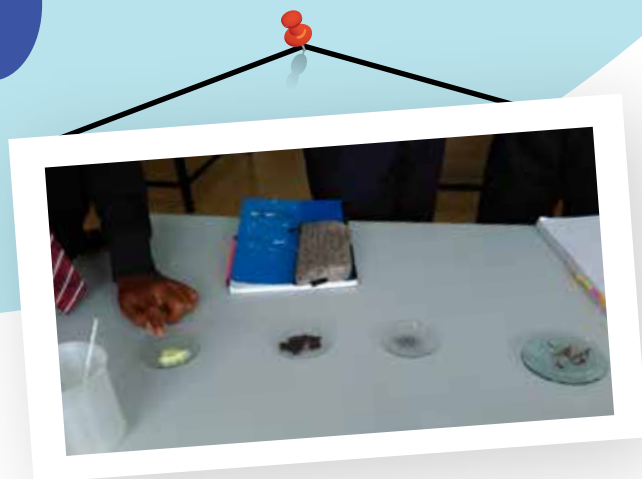
Food samples- rice, corn starch, milk powder, gelatin, oil, were given.

These samples were tested with Benedict's solution. They observed the color change to orange with gelatin and milk powder.

#### 2. Testing for Starch

Above mentioned food samples were tested with iodine solution. They observed the color change to blue black with rice and corn starch.

Students tested the food samples and confirmed the presence of starch and sugar.

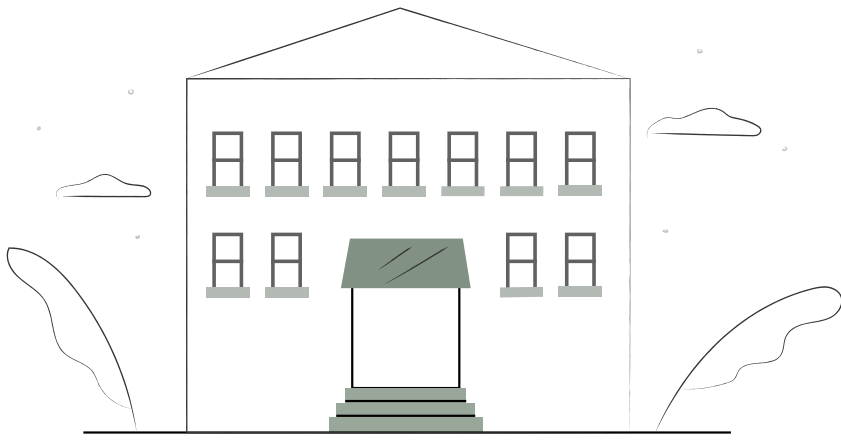
# World Environment Day
