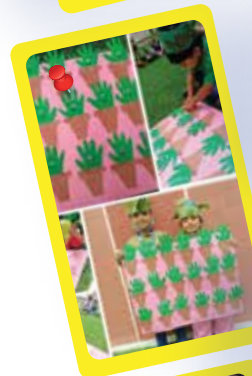
Friendship Day
